The Dickey Center for International Understanding at Dartmouth College is a campus center for the promotion of research, teaching and open dialogue on the vital international issues of our day. Our programs span the disciplines at Dartmouth. We embody three institutes dedicated to cross-disciplinary research on War and Peace, Northern and Polar Regions and Global Health. In addition we offer courses, public lectures and symposia, faculty research support and funding for student research and internships abroad.

The Dickey Center for International Understanding invites applications for visiting fellowships for the 2010-2011 academic year (September 2010-June 2011) from scholars of all disciplines and practitioners from the fields of science and medicine, policy, journalism and humanitarian assistance. Applicants should be willing to devote their time at Dartmouth to writing about a topic of international import, and should be pursuing work that can support the one of the Center's research initiatives – War and Peace (conflict and conflict resolution), the Institute of Arctic Studies (climate change and human response in the Arctic and Antarctic) or Global Health. Fellows are asked to participate in Dickey Center seminars and events and invited to take advantage of other Dartmouth activities.

Consideration of shorter stays (of a term or two) will be given to practitioners who cannot spend an entire year at Dartmouth.

Fellows receive gross stipends of up to \$50,000 for the fellowship period, and are eligible for benefits offered by Dartmouth College if they are not available from their home institutions. Faculty on leave from their home institutions will have half of their annual salary, up to \$50,000, provided by the Dickey Center.

The selection committee will evaluate applications on the basis of:

1. The significance of the proposed research and its relevance to the aims of the Center and its research institutes (War and Peace, The Institute of Arctic Studies, Global Health)
2. The quality of previous research and experience and the ability of the applicant to benefit from the Dickey Center and Dartmouth College
3. The contribution applicants are likely to make to international understanding in their teaching, writing and work on international issues.

How to Apply:

For Fellowships beginning in September 2010, applicants must submit all of the following by January 15, 2010.

1. A curriculum vitae
2. A scholarly or professional paper written in the last three years
3. A statement of up to 1,500 words describing the proposed research project
4. Two letters of reference to be sent directly to the Dickey Center by January 15, 2010.
5. A confidential statement on a separate page indicating the applicant's current salary, what financial support their home institution or other sources are likely
